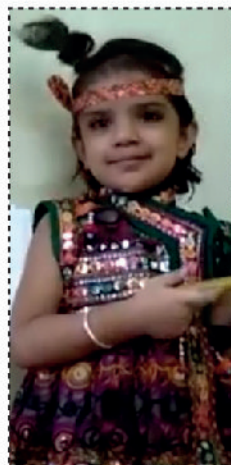
Rakhi making

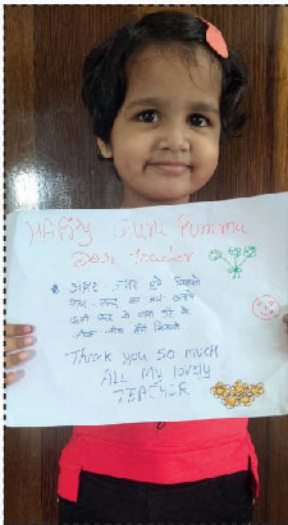
Janmashtami

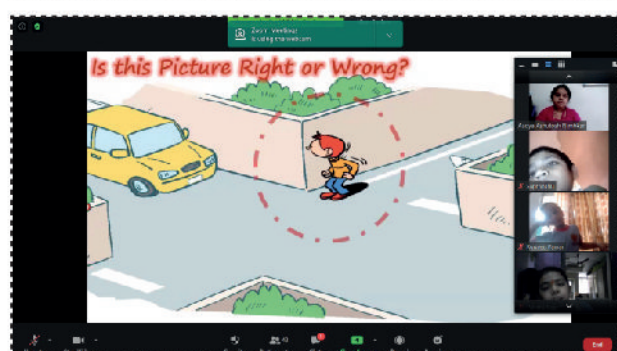
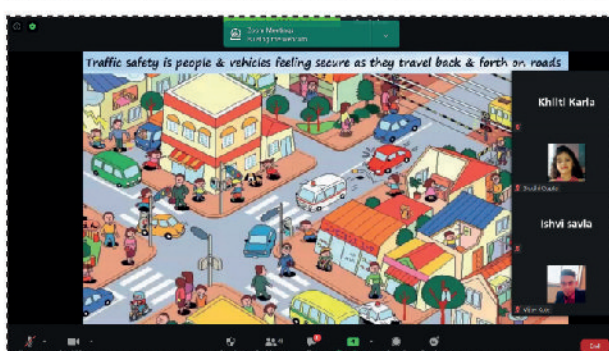
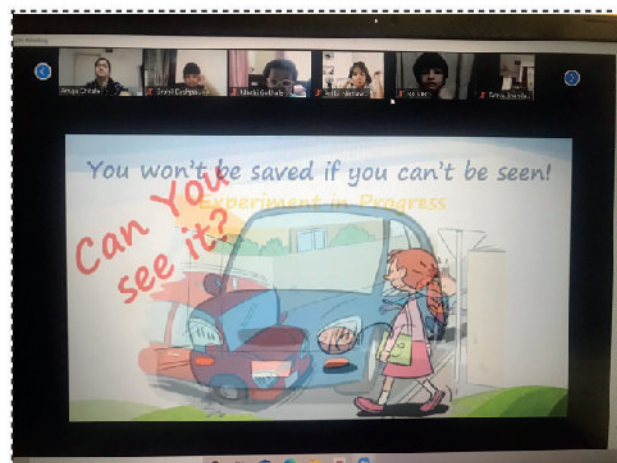
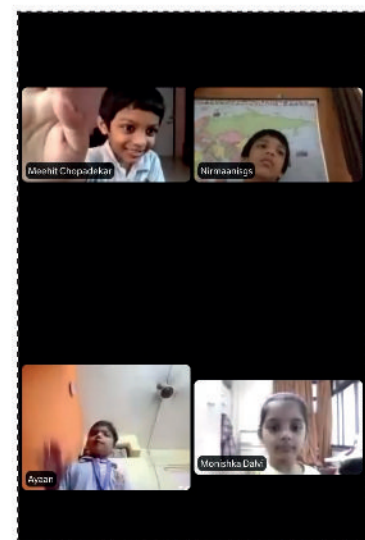
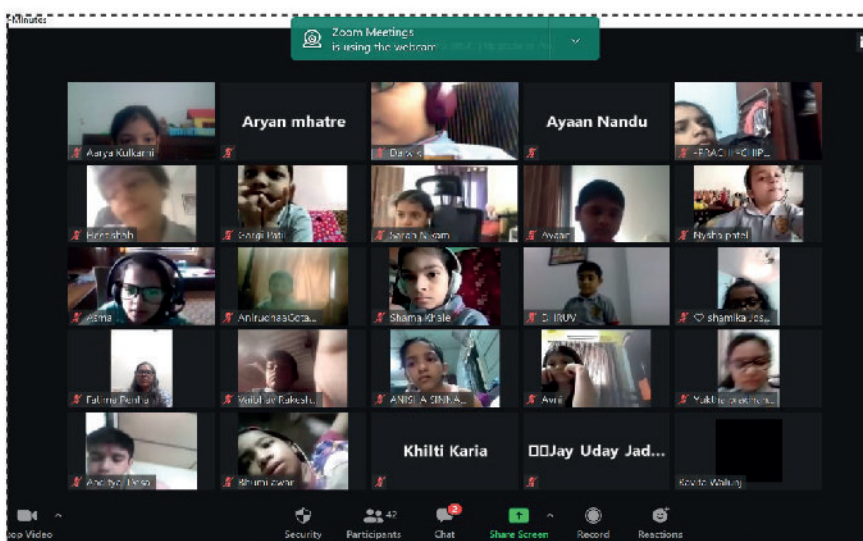
The session was attended by the learners of Pre-Primary & grade 1 & 2. It started with a surprise virtual excursion of the dental clinic. The x-ray machine, the patient's chair, the dentist's mirror, the mouth model and several other materials related to health and hygiene were shown and their uses were explained in detail. The children were made to brush their teeth in the circular motion which is the right way of brushing. It was well enjoyed by the kids and was also a good learning for them. With the help of a colourful PPT Dr Akshata discussed the good eating habits and stressed on eating homemade food, she also suggested on minimizing junk food, sweets, sugar and stressed on rinsing the mouth after every meal.
