
Science Workshop

Basics of Blended Learning




Stoga Workshop

In collaboration with Val- Ed, Indo Scots Global School arranged this interesting session for the Grades 1 and 2 on 15th Feb, 2021. The resource person for the session was Mrs. Ashwini Shivanand.

In this new normal life, the kids are like bored, tired and lazy in short, they are not active, so to boost them this session was conducted. The session started with a Pre-school rhyme with a small twist in it... "If you are happy and you know it clap your hands... "With this Mrs Ashwini connected the emotions with story and yoga. Through story line various poses of Yoga were introduced to the learners and asked them to connect it with their emotions like Happy-Bird or Butterfly pose, feeling high or confident- tree pose, feeling sad or low-Gorilla pose and many more.

Learners enjoyed doing this session. Through such session learners generally are in a better position to vent out his/ her emotions. This session was indeed a wonderful one. The session was interactive and ended on a positive note. It was a great learning experience for both students and the teachers.






Graduation Day
